

1. Greetings – David Hintz
2. Approval of minutes: July and September meeting minutes approved.
3. Treasurer Report: \$ 1259.63 in bank, \$ 8.10 in petty cash.
4. Committee Reports
 - **Social:** Mary Hintz updated our brochure and handed out copies. This will be posted on our city website, and handed out to new neighbors, etc.
 - **Land Issues/Beautification:** There is a suggestion that we get flag poles and flags on Wood Lane and 9th/Westpoint on our lamp posts to decorate. Warren will call WPS and see what it takes to get it done.
 - **Public Safety** – Our policing district has a 3rd new safety officer approved who will be patrolling our area. The city's Gang Task Force is stepping up its work. The majority of the gang problems are on near East and near West side/banks of river. Most gang members are known young teens, who do not have positive things to do. Gang activity is mostly seen in tagging/spray paint. The City of Green Bay budget passed and approved full staffing (192) for our police force for the first time in several years.
 - **Media** – Nextdoor.com has more subscribers now than FaceBook. The new method of publishing minutes will be to put the link to the City Website on our FaceBook, Nextdoor sites, as well as in emails. A call on Facebook and Nextdoor.com for business card newsletter ads has yielded one response.
 - **Fundraising** –David Hintz
 - Ideas to raise our Neighborhood's contribution to Neighborhood Leadership Council is \$250
 - Raffle – Dave checked regulations and we can have a raffle as long as we do what we say we will. Same is heading up getting gift cards. Cheryl will check w/ Cheryl Renier-Wigg at the Neighborhood Division if we have a 501c3 and if we can get a letter stating our fundraising classification. Sam will visit vendors to get gift cards for prizes. We will finish our raffle discussion at our January meeting.
 - Other ideas to discuss at the January meeting: Brat Fry, Social for kids at MacArthur elementary – Tammy Deppe will bring info. Bike event with John Muir in Spring – more information in January.
 - **Other topics**
