The fall season is here. The days have gotten shorter. Many times each week we are going to work in the dark and coming home in the dark. Daylight savings time ends November 3rd. We will be setting our clocks back one hour. As we will be spending more of our time in hours of darkness be aware while you are driving. Already the National Weather Service is predicting cold weather and potential icy conditions on the roads. As you prepare for your morning drive to work think about leaving more time for the drive. This is to take your time, watch your speed and the weather conditions that affect your ability to safely stop your vehicle. Here are some things to think about. Children walking to school for Washington or East High are very rarely wearing any reflective clothing. They are sometimes walking on the side of the street and are difficult to see in the dark. As they walk they assume drivers can see them and are watching out for them. Please watch for this around school zones. Also many of our neighbors still will be walking, running or biking after work. As they are now doing this in the dark take that into consideration. I hope all of you have had a great year so far. My partners Mark Strojny, Craig Carlson and Kevin Kempf have been doing what we can to keep your neighborhood safe and it has been a real pleasure working with all of you. “Apple Bars” by Joy Haupt

Here is a great recipe for apple bars. I found a recipe just for the crust i like and another recipe for the filling and frosting. These bars are great for any occasion.

CRUST (recipe makes one double crust):

2 1/2 cups white flour
 2tbsp. sugar
 1/4 tsp salt
 1/2 cup cold butter, broken into small pieces
 5tbsp. cold vegetable shortening
 8tbsp. ice water

- * measure the flour, sugar and salt together. Stir to combine.
- *Add the chilled butter pieces and shortening to the bowl. Cut them in with a pastry cutter or knife. Don't over mix them.
- * Add the ice water. Mix until the dough holds together (add a bit more water, if necessary).
- *Turn the dough onto alightly floured surgace, knead it together, then divide in half.
- * Flatten each half into a ball, wrap in saran wrap and chill for at least half an hour.
- * Roll out one of the balls on a lightly floured sourface until you have enough to cover a 9x13 pan.

APPLE FILLING:

2 to 3 lbs of apples - peeled, cored and sliced
 1 cup white sugar
 1 tsp ground cinnamon
 2tbsp all-purpose flour
 1/2 cup butter

- *In a large bowl, combine apples, sugar, cinnamon and flour.
- *Place filling in an even layer over prepared crust.
- * Thinly slice 1/2 cup butter and evenly distribute over the apples.
- * Roll out the remaining dough and place over the apple filling.
- * Pierce the top with a fork all over

- *Preheat oven to 400 degrees
- *Bake for 30 min or until apples are soft
- *cool 5 min before frosting

FROSTING:

2 1/2 cups powdered suger
 3tbsp milk
 1/3 cup butter, softened
 1/2 tsp vanilla extract

- *to make frosting
- *combine all ingrediants in small bowl.
- *beat until smooth and creamy
