

Trinity of Heroes

Justin and Jared Mason of Mason Bros. Red Owl are the latest area authors to take up their pens (computers). Their first novel The Trinity of Heroes has been self-published as a digital book through Amazon and through CreateSpace as a paperback. Paperback copies are available for \$10.00 at the store. The authors will also sign and personalize each book. These make perfect gifts for fantasy readers.

The idea for the book was developed by Justin, and then Jared joined the project which quickly enveloped their spare time. The original story didn't make the final cut, but the ideas and characters survived and were reworked to fit a deeper, more complex world. Organization was essential and often times each author would write a part of the story and then they would work together to rewrite it, carefully structuring it to ensure consistent flow and point of view. Consensus on plot was essential before moving on. Their goal was to write a chapter a night, and after working all day at the Red Owl, they would spend evening hours on the novel. Justin credits Peter Cardinal, a regular customer, for inspiration and critiquing the rough draft. Having an editor is crucial, especially to help with character dialogue and how it flows. The authors developed a character in recognition of Peter's assistance. Jared and Justin created characters in the novel that they believe people will be able to relate to. They want readers to have a powerful connection to each of their characters. The authors hope that readers will experience an emotional journey while reading.

The authors described the project as “extremely rewarding.” They are most proud of the amount of work which went into character development, which is the strength of all good stories. If you like fantasy, you will love this book. It is an excellent read for anyone who enjoys a complex character-driven adventure, and can be described as an adult Harry Potter, complete with sorcerers and dragons. Trinity of Heroes is a hybrid between Camelot and the medieval times, but was not written to be historical fiction.

Justin and Jared believe that their confidence in their writing has grown tremendously. Throughout the writing of the first book, and the second, their viewpoint has remained that “the real world is not always hugs and kisses” which is one of the reasons that the book is for mature readers. Characters in each of their books find that they too have to mature, or the result is death. This gives the plot an air of unpredictability; just because a character is a “good guy” does not mean he will succeed, and just because a character is “evil” does not mean he will be defeated.

The first book has already surpassed their expectations and has been well-received by readers. They have set lofty goals, the first of which is finishing their sequel, which is tentatively titled A Grimm Ultimatum. Book two is faster-paced and the plot develops rapidly with more character dialogue. The authors have very strong feelings about the characters and are continuing to explore very deep themes including vengeance, free will of man, and the legacies of generations. No date has been given for the release of the second book, but the authors mentioned that summer of 2015 was a hopeful possibility.


