Dear Parents (Guardians),

Happy Spring! I hope that everyone had a great spring break and found time to enjoy family and friends.

Students in grades 6-8 will be taking the spring MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) Assessments for reading, language arts, and math. The window opens on the 2nd of April. We will be testing throughout the month. Red Smith teachers and staff use the results to support course placement in the area of literacy and math. A detailed schedule will be going home to parents so that you know what days your child will be testing. Results will be mailed home with the end of the year report cards. Please feel free to call me with any questions you may have about this assessment.

The traffic committee met again this past week to take a look at how our new drop off and pick up process is going. We also reviewed feedback that we have received from our parents. We will be creating new signs to support a common understanding of expectations. Don't Be Pressured – Say “No”

As a teen you’re probably starting to realize that saying “no” to peer pressure or avoiding it all together was a lot easier when you were younger. As you get older, negative pressures begin to change. One of these pressures could involve abusing drugs and alcohol.


If you’re being pressured, consider the following:

- **Remember the consequences of abusing drugs and alcohol** – Not only is it illegal, drug and alcohol abuse can quickly lead to high risk situations and to a dangerous addiction.
- **Hang out with a different crowd** – Finding friends you can trust may be difficult at first, but if you can avoid drug and alcohol use pressures, it’s certainly worth it.
- **Walk away from an uncomfortable situation** – When “no” doesn’t seem to be working, simply walking away may be an effective solution.

Talk with parents, teacher or guidance counselor – If you need additional help or ideas on how to avoid drug and alcohol use pressures, talk to the important adults in your life. In addition to ideas, they can also communicate the dangers of drug abuse to other teens that may already have a problem with this.

As many of us struggled to understand this unexpected tragedy, we were also doing our best to support children through their pain. If they didn't already, they now realize that along with love and joy, also comes great sorrow and mourning. As our community continues to struggle through the complexity of emotions, it is extremely important that we continue to encourage and to allow children and teenagers the opportunities to grieve. Our students are experiencing a sense of disbelief, a feeling of numbness, as they work through the grieving process. This is a necessary step for them in order to make sense of their emotions before fully understanding the reality of death. 

Appointment during the school day?

- 1) Bring a note from a parent **to the attendance office** the morning of the appointment before school begins.


Welcome to the Preble Sport Academy

Provide a learning experience in sports for all students, regardless of their background or prior experiences

Improve the injury resistance and athletic performance of all students

Develop inter-dependent, mutually complementing health and sport experiences that are accessible to all families



The PSA offers a variety of sports experiences for your son or daughter, enrolling students from third grade to senior year. The program will start each day at Preble High School or Edison Middle School, starting at 8:30 with a free breakfast. At 9:00, we start our Bellin speed, strength, and agility program. At 10:30, we will break out into our sport specific courses. We end the morning with a free lunch at noon.

The PSA will be run by coaches from Preble, Edison and Red Smith, as well as training staff from the XL program at Bellin. Sports courses, clinics, and camps will be offered in basketball, volleyball, running, football, wrestling, softball, soccer and more.

The three sessions of this summer school program run from June 11-29, July 9-27, and August 6-24. The cost for each academy course is just \$13 or free for those students eligible for free lunch. All the meals are free to all academy students.

If there is sufficient interest, we will provide busing from our elementary schools to Preble and Edison. Please indicate your interest on the sign-up form.
