1. Roll Call.

Ald. Steuer, Ald. Brunette, Ald. Boyce, and Ald. Tim De Wane were present.

2. Approval of the Agenda.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Tim De Wane to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

3. Approval of the minutes from the April 22, 2013 meeting.

A motion was made by Ald. Tim De Wane and seconded by Ald. Brunette to approve the minutes from the April 22, 2013 meeting. Motion carried.

4. Request by the owners of Pearly Gates, 3551 Finger Road, to hold an outdoor event on September 7 and to allow music until midnight.

Ald. Steuer opened the floor without objection.

Jeff Fonferek, 3551 Finger Road, appeared and stated that the event will be held in the parking lot. Security and fencing will be in place. The only access to the parking lot is through the bar. The closest residential neighbors are aware of this event.

A motion was made by Ald. Tim De Wane and seconded by Ald. Brunette to approve the request by the owners of Pearly Gates, 3551 Finger Road, to hold an outdoor event on September 7 and to allow music until midnight. The approval of the request is subject to complaint. Motion carried.

5. Request by the owner of Taqueria Maldonado's, 1737 Main Street, to hold an outdoor event on May 26.

Ald. Steuer opened the floor without objection.

Nobody appeared for this item.

Discussion that followed centered on questions regarding this event, i.e. fencing and security, outdoor music, and ending time.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Tim De Wane to approve the request by the owner of Taqueria Maldonado's, 1737 Main Street, to hold an outdoor event on May 26 contingent on the City Attorney's Office receiving proper information on the event. The approval of the request is subject to complaint. Motion carried.

6. Request by the owners of The Den, 1623 Cass Street, to hold an outdoor event on June 8.

There were no objections by the City Attorney's Office and Police Departments.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Boyce to approve the request by the owners of The Den, 1623 Cass Street, to hold an outdoor event on June 8. The approval of the request is subject to complaint. Motion carried.

7. Request by the owners of Fuzzy's Bar & Grill, 2511 W. Mason Street, to amend their liquor license to include a smoking room.

Ald. Steuer opened the floor without discussion.

Mark Papapetru, 2511 W. Mason Street, appeared and stated that they want patrons to have an outside area adjacent to the bar to smoke their cigarettes so they don't have to leave their drinks in the bar while they are outside having a cigarette. It is a separate room that meets the air requirements. Mr. Papapetru distributed a copy of the building plans he received from the architect and described the addition.

Atty. Mueller recommended that the City Attorney's Office review the building plans with the architect to ensure it meets state requirements before issuing approval.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Tim De Wane to approve the request by the owners of Fuzzy's Bar & Grill, 2511 W. Mason Street, to amend their liquor license to include a smoking room contingent on the City Attorney's Office's approval of the smoking room plans. Motion carried.

8. Application for an available "Class B" Combination License and renewal application by Kathy Broder at 1332 S. Broadway.

There were no objections by the City Attorney's Office.

Capt. Bongle stated that Ms. Broder has completed an approved business plan and the Police Department doesn't have any objections. Capt. Bongle stated that the Police Department does however have concerns about the number of taverns in this area. It is a small isolated area that doesn't have convenience or retail stores, and there are more taverns than the neighborhood can support. They would like to see a lower number of licenses issued in this area.

Kathy Broder, 1332 S. Broadway, appeared and stated she owns the building. Ms. Broder reported that the former owner moved his business down the road and if she doesn't get this license it would bankrupt her.

Discussion centered on issuing a communication to the City Council to look at planning long term use of this area.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Tim De Wane to approve the application for an available "Class B" Combination License and renewal application by Kathy Broder at 1332 S. Broadway with the approval of proper authorities. Motion carried.

9. Request to keep three dogs at 441 Bretcoe Drive.

Atty. Mueller stated that this application has been approved by the Police and Inspection Departments and that the City Attorney's Office has no objections. Atty. Mueller reported that one neighbor did submit a letter of objection.

Nobody appeared for this item.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Steuer to approve the application to keep three dogs at 441 Bretcoe Drive, with the stipulation that upon the death of one of the dogs the applicant must appear back before this Committee for permission to keep more than two dogs. Motion carried.

10. Request to keep three dogs at 536 Fred Street.

Atty. Mueller stated that this application has been approved by the Police and Inspection Departments and that the City Attorney's Office has no objections. Atty. Mueller stated no letters of objection were submitted.

A motion was made by Ald. Boyce and seconded by Ald. Brunette to approve the application to keep three dogs at 536 Fred Street, with the stipulation that upon the death of one of the dogs the applicant must appear back before this Committee for permission to keep more than two dogs. Motion carried.

11. Request to keep three dogs at 724 Garden Street.

Atty. Mueller stated that this application has been approved by the Police and Inspection Departments and the City Attorney's Office has no objections.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Tim De Wane to approve the application to keep three dogs at 724 Garden Street, with the stipulation that upon the death of one of the dogs the applicant must appear back before this Committee for permission to keep more than two dogs. Motion carried.

12. Request by Historical Preservation Committee to adopt draft ordinance relating to razing of historical buildings with possible action.

Ald. Steuer opened the floor without objection.

Roger Retzlaff, 100 N. Jefferson Street, Chairperson of the City of Green Bay Historical Preservation Commission (HPC), appeared and stated the reason HPC is seeking this ordinance is on a number of occasions they discovered that buildings of cultural or significant architecture to the City were razed without their knowledge. They would like to make the community aware of the loss some of these razes create. They are requesting a waiting period to recognize and document if the building is an asset to the community before it gets razed. Mr. Retzlaff stated the 1950-1970's was a time of experiment architecturally and they don't want to lose track of what those times represented, the notable designs and the

architects/firms who designed these buildings. It isn't their intention to stop the razing process; they would like to have documentation that the design and building existed.

Cheryl Renier-Wigg, City of Green Bay Neighborhood Division, appeared and stated that she is the individual responsible for ordering buildings to be razed in Green Bay. Ms. Renier-Wigg stated as an owner of a home built in the 1890's she understands HPC's goals but also has concerns regarding the wording in the draft ordinance. The ordinance age pertains to close to half of the buildings in the City. There are approximately 50 buildings per year ordered to be razed, and it could cause a significant glitch in the process if permission must be given before razing occurs. She had concerns regarding: time limit HPC needs if determination is made that the building is historically significant, what is their criteria, is there an appeal process, does this include garages, interior remodeling, or razing a portion of the building. A lot of the buildings that are ordered to be razed are condemned properties that have been a nuisance for awhile; waiting for permission could set their plans back as much as five weeks. She would like this ordinance to have more definition and offered her assistance to work on it.

Kevin King, Green Bay Neighborhood Development Specialist, stated that there is a document in place created in 1983 that recorded dwellings of significant history in the City. This document is federally required and it would cost a lot of money to update it.

Ald. Steuer stated he turned in a communication to the City Council requesting that the Neighborhood Association Leadership Council conduct a survey of historical dwellings in their districts.

Atty. Mueller acknowledged that there are some issues with this draft ordinance that could be clarified such as the holding deadline and appeal process. He would like to have it referred back to staff to refine it.

Roger Retzlaff reappeared and stated that Green Bay is the oldest community in the State and has already lost many valuable properties. Administrative procedures need to be established to stop this from continuing.

A motion was made by Ald. Tim De Wane and seconded by Ald. Brunette to refer to staff the request by Historical Preservation Committee to adopt draft ordinance relating to razing of historical buildings. Motion carried.

13. Appeal by Ashley Jackson to the denial of her operator license application.

Atty. Mueller stated the City Attorney's Office recommends denial based on the applicant's arrest and conviction record and failure to disclose these violations which substantially relate to the licensed activity. Ms. Jackson has a 2010 misdemeanor for resisting or obstructing an officer; and disorderly conduct forfeitures in 2009 and 2008.

Capt. Bongle stated that the Police Department also has concerns when an individual doesn't disclose their criminal history.

Ald. Steuer opened the floor without objection.

Ashley Jackson, 1240 Ponderosa Ave. #2, appeared and stated in Oconto County she was told that if she attended a one year VIP probation program her record would be expunged. Since she followed through with that she didn't write down any convictions because she believed her record had been cleared. She was licensed in Green Bay in 2005-2006. She is

currently working in a daycare and not in a tavern, but renews her license every two years so she doesn't have to take the Responsible Beverage Server course again.

Atty. Mueller showed Ms. Jackson that her conviction record still appears on CCAP. He advised her to contact Oconto County Circuit Court if she believes her record should be expunged.

Ald. Brunette stated he doesn't feel comfortable giving Ms. Jackson the license without proof of what she stated regarding her record being expunged. Ms. Jackson was asked if it would create a hardship if she wasn't given the license at tonight's meeting, she replied it wouldn't as she wasn't currently tending bar. Ms. Jackson was encouraged to provide proof from Oconto County that her record was cleared as well as letters of recommendations from her employer(s) and bring them to the next meeting where they will make a determination then.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Tim De Wane to postpone until the next meeting the appeal by Ashley Jackson to the denial of her operator license application. Motion carried.

14. Appeal by Amber Lynn Holiday to the denial of her operator license application.

Atty. Mueller stated the City Attorney's Office recommends denial based on the applicant's arrest and conviction record and her failure to disclose this on the application. Atty. Mueller stated that after Ms. Holiday was denied she revealed these charges with her appeal. The traffic citations may be disregarded; however the underage drinking and drug charges substantially relate to the licensed activity.

Capt. Bongle stated the Police Department has the same concerns as Ms. Jackson was charged with maintaining a drug trafficking place and felony possession with intent to deliver.

Ald. Steuer opened the floor without objection.

Amber Lynn Holiday, 1581 Chicago Street, appeared and stated she used to be a party girl but has changed. The maintaining a drug trafficking place was dismissed because it wasn't her house, it was her ex-boyfriends, but they did charge her as party to the crime since some of her belongings were in the house. She is currently residing with her parents and works nights and sleeps during the day and is staying out of trouble.

Ald. Steuer stated there are a lot of violations and not a lot of time has passed since the last few. Ms. Holiday reported she hung out with the wrong people and they were the ones who usually had the drugs or caused the problems, but she got charged for them. Ms. Jackson said she wants her life to take a different path and wants to stay away from trouble. She sells alcohol in a gas station from 10 p.m. until mid-night, she doesn't want to be a bartender.

Ald. Brunette stated they are not here to judge her. They are here to protect the welfare of the public. Because of her record, with the current charges, he doesn't feel comfortable allowing her to sell alcohol to the public at this point.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Steuer to deny the appeal by Amber Lynn Holiday to the denial of her operator license application. Motion carried.

15. Appeal by Jonathan Le Breck to the denial of his operator license application.

Atty. Mueller stated the City Attorney's Office recommends denial based on the applicant's arrest and conviction record and his failure to disclose violations on the application. There are misdemeanors charges in 2003 for possession of cocaine and THC; 2007 forfeiture charge of battery and a second charge of battery; 2008 misdemeanor possession of THC. The applicant was approved for a license in 2010. In 2011, Mr. Le Breck was involved in two incidents involving alcohol and was convicted of criminal damage to property and disorderly conduct.

Ald. Steuer opened the floor without objection.

Jonathan Le Breck, 1260 Porlier Street, appeared and stated he forgot about the 2011 incident and thought he only had to write down felonies. He stated he got into a verbal argument with his girlfriend after drinking one night and the police were called. He was charged for kicking in his own TV.

Ald. Steuer inquired if the application states only felonies must be revealed. Atty. Mueller responded the application states you must reveal any felony, misdemeanor or ordinance violations, other than minor traffic violations.

Mr. Le Breck reported that this Committee already gave him the license in 2010 and doesn't understand why he can't get it now. Ald. Steuer stated that there were different members on the Protection & Welfare Committee in 2010. Atty. Mueller stated that the Committee gave him a chance in 2010, and based off of police reports he had additional alcohol related issues in 2011. Mr. Le Breck denied he was intoxicated when he was arrested in 2011.

Discussion followed that Mr. Le Breck was given a chance in 2010 to change his behavior and the Committee's designation to protect the community.

Mr. Le Breck wanted to know if he is denied if it will affect his future attempts at receiving a license as he may want to open a restaurant that serves alcohol. It was suggested that Mr. Le Breck withdraw his application and stay out of trouble.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Tim De Wane to receive and place on file the appeal by Jonathan Le Breck to the denial of his operator license application. Motion carried.

16. Appeal by Brookes Mann to the denial of her secondhand article dealer license application.

Atty. Mueller stated that this application is similar to running a pawn shop and the City Attorney's Office recommends denial based on the applicant's arrest and conviction record. In 2009 there were two misdemeanor charges for battery and disorderly conduct; 2002 disorderly conduct misdemeanor and a battery forfeiture; and another disorderly conduct forfeiture in 2002. All of these are behavioral types of violations which substantially relate to the licensed activity.

Capt. Bongle stated the Police Department has the same concerns.

Ald. Steuer opened the floor without objection.

Brookes Mann, 1372 LaCount Road, appeared and admitted in 2009 she was a party to a crime and spent a year in jail. She completed anger management classes and no longer drinks. She opened a thrift store with family members and is trying to live a constructive life and support her children.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Tim De Wane to approve the appeal by Brookes Mann to the denial of her secondhand article dealer license application. Motion carried.

17. Applications for various liquor/beer licenses for the 2013-14 License Year.

Atty. Mueller informed the Committee that all liquor licenses expire June 30 and these are renewals and the City Attorney's Office has no objections to the listed establishments.

There were no objections from the Police Department.

A motion was made by Ald. Steuer and seconded by Ald. Tim De Wane to approve the application for various liquor/beer licenses for the 2013-14 License Year. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ald. Brunette and seconded by Ald. Steuer to adjourn the meeting at 6:20 p.m. Motion carried.
