1. Consent Agenda

- a. The meeting of February 6, 2014 was called to order at 5:30pm. Minutes of March 6, 2014 and a current financial report were approved with a motion made by Skip Wilson of Baird Creek Neighborhood Association and seconded by Scott Vanidestine of Wilder Park Neighborhood Association, all in favor. Motion Carried

2. Mayor's Report

- a. The mayor welcomed the new Alderman Randy Scannal for District 7
- b. The mayor thanked everyone for their support for the kidney awareness campaign that took place earlier in the day at City Hall
- c. A reminder that Kid's Day is coming up quick on June 25th, to honor kids in Green Bay. The brochure was just approved earlier in the day and there will be new things to do this year
- d. This summer there will be a Read to feed program to work on improving reading proficiency for area kids. For every book read, one can of food will be donated to Paul's Pantry
- e. Green Bay has recently launched Green Bay Public Television. To be developed is community programming in which the Mayor is looking to have a neighborhood segment. If you have any ideas please bring them to him

3. Panel Discussion on Rummage Sales

- a. Rummage sales are a very effective way to bring people into your neighborhood, and get people to talk and get to know one another. They also can provide for a fundraising opportunity
- b. Angie Cook of John Muir Park NA informed everyone that they do a blurb in their newsletter about the upcoming rummage sale and have them contact her so she can put it on a map. They also do Craigslist ads, Press Gazette Online ads, and post in rummage sale blogs. Having park pavilion bathrooms open is another tip she suggested

- c. Jim Haskins of Olde Norwood NA suggested having neighborhood rummage sales the first weekend of the month because that is right after people get paid. He also suggested pricing half of what a thrift store would price the item and advertising on the TV community calendar. For the day of the rummage sale it is good to have electrical outlets nearby so people can test electronic items
 - d. Dan Theno of Oak Grove NA suggested having the same signs from year to year but not putting dates on them, just writing, "Neighborhood Rummage Sale this Saturday and Sunday," that way they can be used year after year. He also suggested putting a yard sign in each yard that will be having a rummage sale. A new thing Oak Grove NA will be doing this year is putting an advertisement in their newsletter that lets people know that if they have items they do not want but do not want to have a rummage sale, to bring them to a certain location and they will be sold as a fundraiser for the association
 - e. A complete list of the tips learned from the rummage sale discussion will be typed up and uploaded online with the April minutes
 - f. Captain Bill Bongle informed everyone to be aware of people using rummage sales for passing counterfeit bills. Most of the counterfeit bills one would see are 20's, but 100's are also a red flag
- 4. Capital Campaign Kick-Off**
- a. The GBNLC is run by all private dollars, every few years a capital campaign is held to fundraise for the GBNLC. It is that time again. This campaign's goal is \$500,000
 - b. All neighborhood associations were asked to take a part in fundraising and received a capital campaign packet. More information and direction on neighborhood association fundraising will be coming in the upcoming weeks
 - c. Tom Hinz challenged the neighborhood associations to know their mission statements
 - d. Hinz did a shout out for the Air Force Band Concert that will be taking place on Sunday, April 13 at West High School from 3-5pm. It is free of charge
- 5. City Staff Updates**
- a. The City funded mini-grant application is now available! Since these are City funded applications, they do require the signature of the primary Alderman of the neighborhood association area. Applications are due May 2nd
 - b. It was the last meeting for President Greg Maloney of Northwest Railway Gardens, he thanked everyone for all their help and guidance they provided
 - c. CSI's of District A reported that the most problems occur where there are no neighborhood associations and in the upcoming months they will be working on community engagement
 - d. CSI's of District B reported they have been working on compliance checks with alcohol and that the shots fired on Chestnut pose no immediate danger
 - e. CSI's of District C reported they have been patrolling the library more frequently
 - f. CSI's of District D reported about what makes vehicles more likely to be broken in to (leaving property in plain view, doors unlocked, and windows open) and talked about their vehicle report cards
 - g. Captain Bill Bongle reported of the incident on Chestnut St., and that it was a traumatic event but the people who were involved most likely already knew each other
