This would only be for the April 7, 2020 Election.

My name is Demirkan Coker, and I am an undergraduate research assistant for Professor Milan Svolik at Yale University. Professor Svolik and I are working on a project concerning voter behavior in the April 7 Wisconsin Supreme Court elections.

We are looking for ward-by-ward results for the recent April 7 Supreme Court election, as well as the Spring 2019 election, disaggregated between in-person and mail-in voters. The Wisconsin Election Commission informed us that the City of Green Bay is one of the 35 municipalities that count absentee ballots centrally and are able to break down the results in this manner.

Professor Svolik and I would be grateful if you could provide us with this data for both elections. I am looking forward to hearing from you and hope you stay safe.
