Dear City Resident:

Enclosed is your Wisconsin Voter Registration form that was submitted through the mail. The paperwork included for proof of residence is not adequate. Please look over the list again and if you have any questions, please contact our office at 920-448-3058.

You can now register on-line through MyVote.WI.gov as long as your address on your driver license/ID has been updated with the Department of Motor Vehicles. The current information at the DMV is considered proof of residence.

Valid forms of proof of residence must include the voter's name and current address, and may be any of the following when registering through the mail or in person:

1. A current and valid Wisconsin driver license or identification card.
2. Any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit.
3. Any identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business and bearing a photo of the card holder, but not including a business card.
4. A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year of the year preceding the date of the election.
5. A university, college or technical college identification card (must include photo) **ONLY** if the voter provides a fee receipt dated within the last 9 months or the institution provides a certified housing list to the municipal clerk.
6. A gas, electric, or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing no earlier than 90 days before the day registration is made. It cannot be through a second carrier, must come directly from the utility company.
7. Bank or Credit Card Statement.
8. Paycheck.
9. A check or other document issued by a unit of government.
10. An affidavit on public or private social service agency letterhead identifying a homeless voter and describing the individual's residence for voting purposes.

11. Residential lease that is effective on the date of registration (not valid if you are registering by mail).

The last day to register through the mail or on-line is July 22, 2020. After this date, registrations may be done in person at the Clerk's office until August 7, 2020 and on Election Day at your polling location. Proof of residence is a requirement to be included with all registrations.
