

Green Bay Election 2020 Voter Information Guide

Every Vote Counts

Thank you for planning ahead to cast your 2020 ballot. Green Bay voters have many options.



First, register to vote or check your registration

AND

Vote absentee-by-mail

OR

Vote early in-person absentee by visiting City Hall, beginning October 20, 2020

OR

Vote at a polling place on Election Day, November 3, 2020

First—What do I need to vote?

Am I registered to vote? Is my address up to date?

1. Go to myvote.wi.gov
2. Click on “register to vote”
3. Enter your first name, last name and date of birth
4. Follow the instructions to register or update your address
 - Register to vote or update your address or name online until October 14
 - You can also register in-person at the Clerk’s office at City Hall, 100 N. Jefferson Street (October 15 to October 30)

How do I vote absentee by mail?

This year, you can vote from the physically-distanced safety of your home. Make your voice heard and help slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

1. Request your absentee ballot

- Request an absentee ballot by going to myvote.wi.gov
- Click on “vote absentee”
- Enter your first name, last name and date of birth, and follow the instructions.
- You may need to provide a picture of your photo ID. Easily upload a picture when you request online or include a photocopy if you’re requesting by mail. [Watch helpful videos online.](#)

Plan Ahead! We know you’re busy. Request your ballot as soon as possible to make sure you have enough time to vote and return your ballot. We recommend you request your ballot by October 10th. You should receive it in the mail by October 17th.

2. Complete the Ballot

- When you receive your ballot in the mail, open the outer envelope
- Read the instructions
- Vote your ballot with a black ball point pen
- Place the ballot inside the return envelope
- Sign the return envelope and get a witness to sign their name and give their address

3. Return and Track your ballot

- **Mail your ballot as soon as possible – do it right away! We recommend mailing your ballot by October 19.** Your ballot must be received by the Clerk’s office by November 3rd.

Stat. § 12.60(1)(b), that I am a resident of the ward of the municipality in the county of the state of Wisconsin indicated hereon, and am entitled to vote in the ward at the election indicated hereon; that I am not voting at any other location in this election; that I am unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place in the ward on election day; or I have changed my residence within the state from one ward to another later than 10 days before the election. I certify that I exhibited the enclosed ballot, unmarked, to the witness, that I then in the presence of the witness and in the presence of no other person marked the ballot and enclosed and sealed the ballot in this envelope in a manner that no one but myself and any person providing assistance under Wis. Stat. § 6.87(5), if I requested assistance, could know how I voted. I further certify that I requested this ballot.

5 Mail back your ballot. Allow 4-5 days for delivery to ensure your ballot is received by Election Day. Ballots received after Election Day will NOT be counted.		



How do I vote early in-person absentee at City Hall beginning 10/20?

- Voting early in-person absentee is as simple as 1-2-3!
 - Make sure you've registered in advance first, or you can register when you arrive at the Clerk's Office. See above for "First—what do I need to vote?"
1. Come to City Hall (100 N. Jefferson) during the [operating hours](#) beginning October 20, 2020
 2. Don't forget to bring your photo ID
 3. Please wear a mask inside City Hall. We will provide you one if you forget. We are asking voters to do this for everyone's safety.

How do I vote in-person on Election Day, November 3, 2020?

1. First, check your polling location by going to myvote.wi.gov
 - Click on "Find my polling place"
 - Enter your street address, unit/apt number (if applicable), city and zip
2. Remember your photo ID
3. If you aren't registered, you can register and vote at your [polling location](#) on Election Day
4. Polls are open 7 am to 8 pm.

If you can, come to the polling location on off-hours to avoid lines and crowds:

- Between 9 am and noon
 - Between 1 pm and 4 pm
- Tip: Buses are free on Election Day! Visit www.greenbaymetro.org for routes and schedules
 - How do I stay safe while voting in-person?
 - We will provide hand sanitizer to help keep your hands clean before, during, and after voting. You can bring your own hand sanitizer if you prefer.
 - Wash your hands when you arrive back to your home or work.
 - Wearing a mask while voting is optional, not required. However, wearing a mask helps to stop the spread of the virus, and the City encourages voters to take this precaution while casting a ballot.

Before you get started: Register to vote or make sure the address on your registration is up-to-date at myvote.wi.gov.

Voting absentee is as simple as 1-2-3!

1. Request an absentee ballot at MyVote.WI.Gov

2. Complete the ballot



Open the ballot and read the instructions



Sign the envelope



Get a witness to sign the envelope and provide an address (picture)

3. Return the absentee ballot

By mail, by Monday, October 19th

--OR--

In a drop box, by Halloween (October 31st)
